



Get on board Ballarat's buses with myki

The ticketing system on Ballarat's town buses has been transformed to introduce a new smart card ticketing system, myki.

What is myki?

myki is a durable, reusable plastic smart card that stores money and/or travel days. Students can use myki each time they travel on the bus and top it up when the myki balance is low.

What are the benefits of myki?

Travelling with myki offers simplicity and removes the need to purchase two hour or daily concession tickets. Students won't need to find loose change for bus fares and using a child or concession myki is cheaper than buying a concession ticket. They also have the freedom to travel on Ballarat's buses using the same card.

Are there any changes to a student's concession entitlements?

No. Students who are eligible for concession benefits today still receive the same concession benefits with myki. There are no changes to the way student passes, Victorian Public Transport Student Concession Cards or conveyance passes are issued or used.
