Medical Information

2. Fill out the form and return to the teacher-in-charge on the morning of camp with any medication that is required. All medication must be clearly marked with the student's name, supplied in original packaging and must be within the expiry date. It is preferable that the medication and the form are placed in a clear plastic zip-lock bag with the student's name clearly marked on it.
 - No student is to be in possession of any medication while participating in the camp with the exception of asthma medication.
